School Nutrition Advocates For Critical Funding

GCSS Director of School Nutrition Penny Fowler and School Nutrition Coordinator Emily House recently attended the 2017 GSNA (Georgia School Nutrition Association) Legislative Advocacy Conference in Atlanta.

GSNA supports education reform efforts currently underway led by Governor Nathan Deal and other state leaders and has requested that critical state funding for school nutrition be continued in order to maintain quality school nutrition programs. The association advocates for maintaining funding of health insurance benefits for all school nutrition employees and for increasing funding for the Public School Employees Retirement System (PSERS) from the current \$14.75 to \$15.25 per year of service.

Mrs. Fowler and Mrs. House had the opportunity to meet with Governor Deal as well as local state representative, Matt Dubnik, who serves Hall County. Mrs. Fowler stated that this was their first time advocating on behalf of the School Nutrition program and its employees. She affirms that the event was a huge success and plans to attend again next year.

GMS students experience college life at UGA

So far this school year, the University of Georgia was the second college visited by the Gainesville Middle School REACH scholars and 6th, 7th and 8th grade peer tutors' helpers.

Students were provided opportunities to obtain a range of facts about the college life of students on campus. The University of Georgia Arch Society facilitator's tour guides were very instrumental in sharing the importance of maintaining good grades and getting involved in extracurricular activities. Students experienced the ringing of the chapel bell, learned about the original University mascot, rode the campus bus, and ate on campus. They learned that historically the ringing of the chapel bell was utilized as a class change bell for the entire campus, and that UGA's first mascot was a goat and was later changed to a bulldog based on a reporter's analogy of the team's style of play in a particular football game.

The students asked key questions about their selected majors and learned that the average student who attends the University of Georgia has a 4.1 grade point average. The students took a college survey and learning style assessment and then shared one thing they learned during the visit. One seventh grader wrote, "Even if people don't have a perfect GPA...you can still get in, but you have to have a lot of confidence and know how to communicate and express yourself well." Many of the students wrote thank you cards to express their appreciation for the awesome college experience. The tour enabled them to realize that with good grades and determination they can also be students at UGA someday or at any college that they aspire to attend.

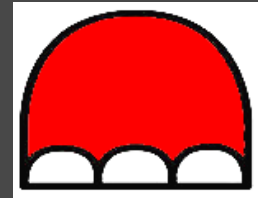
