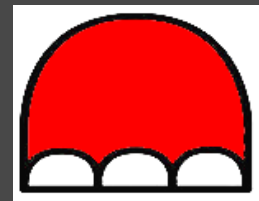

Transitioning From High School To High Tech



GHS students visit local industries

Gainesville High School, in collaboration with the High School High Tech organization, has taken students to two different tours during the month of February. The students' first trip was to King's Hawaiian and Lanier Technical College. The second trip was to the Caterpillar Plant in Bogart, Georgia. Students met with counselors and industry specialists to learn more about opportunities and the next steps that they can take after they graduate from high school.

High School-High Tech (HS-HT) is a program offered through the U.S. Department of Labor and the Office of Disability Employment Policy (ODEP). The goal of HS - HT is to provide opportunities for students with various types of disabilities to explore post-secondary options, training and employment. Through this partnership, students have access to a broad range of academic and career development

resources and experiences that will enable them to successfully meet the workforce demands of the 21st century. Activities include college and technical school tours, Q&A sessions with admissions personnel and advisors, tours with area businesses, career planning and soft skills development.

Gainesville High School's chapter of HSHT is comprised of 24 students and 3 advisors, and is open to any junior or senior student with an Individualized Education Plan (IEP). Ms. Stacia Dillin, SPED Transition Specialist for grades 6-12, coordinated the program this year in an effort to strengthen transition planning services offered to Gainesville High School students with disabilities.

Educational Support For Students With Special Needs



The Gainesville City School System Department of Special Education provides educational support for students ages 3-21, who meet eligibility guidelines in the following areas: Autism, Deaf, Emotional Behavioral Disorder, Intellectual Disability, Orthopedic Impairment, Other Health Impaired, Significantly Developmentally Delayed, Speech / Language Impairment, Traumatic Brain Injury, and Visual Impairment. The special education team consists of 50 teachers and 34 paraprofessionals who work together with general education teachers and administrators to help build developmentally appropriate learning opportunities for students with exceptionalities in grades PK-12. The primary goal of special education services within our schools is to ensure that students with disabilities are provided access to the general education curriculum in the general education setting to the maximum extent possible, as mandated by The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).

An integral part of the school system, the Special Education department is a component of the Office of Academic Affairs and makes every effort to ensure that students have equal access to all
