GHS Math Teams Tackle Mega Challenge

Gainesville High School had two teams to compete in the Moody's Mega Math Challenge, a prestigious competition for high school juniors and seniors to develop a mathematical model for a real world problem. The challenge posed a real-world problem entirely unknown to the team members and involved extensive research, computational skills, in-depth analysis, and communication skills. Scholarship prizes totaling \$150,000 will be awarded to the top teams.

For this year's challenge, GHS math teams used mathematical models to look into national parks and address climate-related issues. The teams had to finish the project within a fourteen hour window, working continuously for two days to produce their final reports. Team A included Pratyusha Karnati, Anna Diaz, Stephen McMarrow, and Vraj Patel. Team B included Tyra Newton, Spencer Sumner, Michelle Razo, and Umer Khan. Mr. Chandra Karnati, a math teacher at GHS, served as the teams' mentor.

Team A advanced to the second round of the competition, being one of the 200 teams out of 1,121 total to advance to the next level. This is

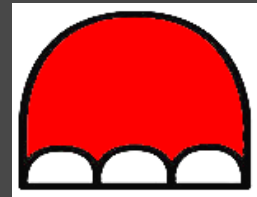
Recently, more than 900 school nutrition professionals met on Capitol Hill to urge Congress to protect and strengthen school meal programs for more than 30 million students they serve every school day. The effort is part of the School Nutrition Association (SNA) 45th Annual Legislative Action Conference (LAC) held on April 2nd-4th.

The conference culminated in Tuesday's "Charge to the Hill", where attendees were able to share with Congress their school districts' concerns regarding school nutrition programs. LAC attendees met with their House and Senate members to discuss SNA's 2017 Position Paper, which calls on Congress to oppose school meal block grants, expand USDA foods to support the school breakfast program, and provide practical flexibility under a few of the nutrition standards for school meals.

Last year's House-proposed block grant threatened to slash funds for school nutrition, limit student access to healthy meals and abolish all federal school nutrition standards. "SNA members sent Congress a resounding message that block grants will harm students and cripple school meal programs, which ensure America's children have the nutrition they need to succeed in school," said SNA President Becky Domokos-Bays, PhD, RD, SNS.

LAC attendees from across the nation heard from Senator John Hoeven (R-ND) and other Washington insiders on the impact of the

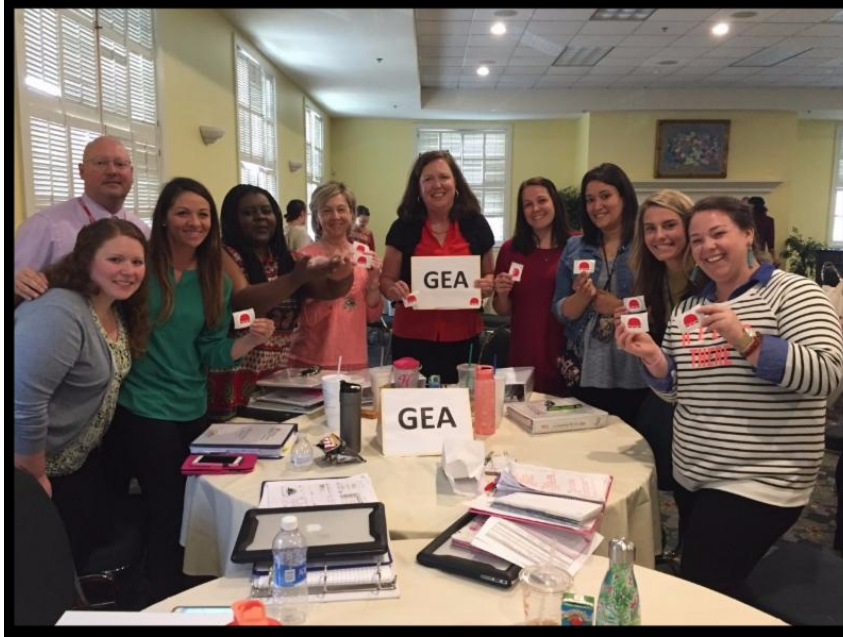

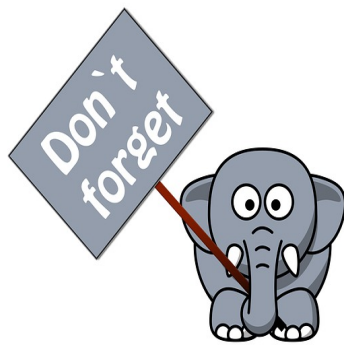
