Gainesville High School's FCCLA students competed at the 2017 National FCCLA Leadership Conference in Nashville, Tennessee this summer. With over 12,000 students from more than 40 states and Puerto Rico competing in various competitions, GHS students had the opportunity to compete and earn medals in their competitive events. Seven of the nine students who competed were GHS graduates and will be attending college this fall.

Riley White and Caroline Reames won second place at the conference, receiving a Silver medal in the AquaWarriors competition for their work in building an aquaponic garden with assistance from the GHS Construction and AP Human Geography students. 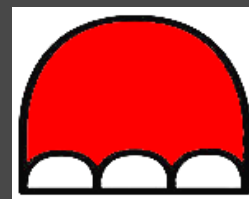

how to use instructional technology to increase students' creative learning through project-based learning strategies and to provide students with 24/7 access to curriculum learning and resources. The workshops covered how to integrate instructional technology tools in the classroom, create blended learning environments for students within and outside the classroom, utilize 3D modeling and printing, and learn the skills and instructional pedagogy necessary to become a Google Certified Educator Level 1 teacher.

Google Certification requires teachers to learn how to utilize all of the Google Suite tools in order to provide students with learning experiences that utilize technology to enhance communication, collaboration, creativity, and critical thinking. Teachers learned how to effectively use Google Drive, Docs, Slides, Sheets, Classroom, YouTube, and Sites.

Teachers were also trained on how to use Virtual Reality technology. They learned how to operate Flashforge Creator Pro 3D printers and how to utilize CAD (Computer Aided Design) programs such as OnShape and Tinkercad.

At the end of the workshop, teachers were able to proficiently design and create their own project-based learning assignments for classroom instruction to enable students to apply their knowledge through the use of technology.

Gainesville City School System and Hall County Health Department want to remind parents to avoid the rush and get their children's required school vaccinations now. For convenience, the health department is holding a special vaccination emphasis from July 5th to August 4th during normal business hours. Parents can also get vaccinations from their child's health care provider.

GCSS Proof of Residency Requirements



Beginning July 17th, all students attending the Gainesville City School System will be required to provide two updated proofs of residency to the school that they attend.

Acceptable proofs of residency include one of the following:

- non-contingent sales contract
- current lease/rental agreement
- most recent income tax return or IRS Form 1099
- current paycheck stub
- current warranty or quit claim deed
- current home purchase agreement
- current homeowner's insurance policy

Additionally, one of the following must be provided:

- current gas bill (within last 30 days)
- current water bill (within last 30 days)
- current electric bill (within last 30 days)
- current cable/internet bill (with service address within last 30 days)
- Students who are non-residents will be required to submit one proof of residency from the list in order to verify mailing address for the school.

Students who do not present valid proofs of residency by September 1st will be withdrawn as of that date.

Parents and guardians should contact their child's school for any questions concerning this process.

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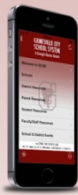

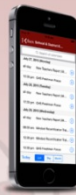


Here are some amazing features to look forward to and things you can do with the GCSS app:
