GCSS graduates of RISE summer program

This summer one hundred and eighteen students from the Gainesville City School System participated in the RISE (Real Interactive Summer-learning Experience) Summer Program commemorating the sixth year of a joint partnership between Gainesville Housing Authority, Gainesville City School System, United Way of Hall County, and Brenau University. On July 14th, GCSS students concluded the 6-week program with a RISE commencement held at Fair Street International Academy with friends and family in attendance. Graduation activities included a processional followed by student presentations and a keynote address. Students were all smiles as they received certificates for their satisfactory completion of the program.

During the summer, RISE participants engaged in a wide variety of educational and recreational opportunities including reading, writing, math, computer skills development, supervised field trips, play/fitness activities, and arts & crafts activities utilizing an interactive learning environment to reinforce Georgia Standards learning objectives. Program activities occurred at the Gainesville Housing Authority's Melrose Community Center and Fair Street International Academy. Students had access to fully-equipped computer labs, the Fair Street STEAM lab and use of the playgrounds. With the goal of exposing the children to educational field trips, each week they traveled to different destinations such as Elachee Nature Center, Chattahoochee River Keeper's Chota Princess (a floating classroom/Lake Lanier boat), Skate Country, Gainesville Bowling Center, and Truelove Dairy Farm. After each field trip, the students visited the Frances Meadows Aquatic Center to participate in swimming activities.

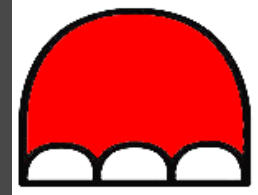
By offering the RISE program within the local community, participants were accessible to resources that challenged their intellect along with their physical capabilities. Each summer the program provides curriculum-based learning opportunities that reinforce classroom standards that students need to become successful and confident in school. The program's long-term goals are for students to graduate from high school on time and to achieve self-sufficiency as adults with healthy lifestyle habits.

GCSS Proof of Residency Requirements



All students attending the Gainesville City School System are required to provide two updated proofs of residency to the school that they attend.

Acceptable proofs of residency include one of the following:

- non-contingent sales contract
- current lease/rental agreement
- most recent income tax return or IRS Form 1099
- current paycheck stub
- current warranty or quit claim deed
- current home purchase agreement
- current homeowner's insurance policy

Additionally, one of the following must be provided:

- current gas bill (within last 30 days)
- current water bill (within last 30 days)
- current electric bill (within last 30 days)
- current cable/internet bill (with service address within last 30 days)
- Students who are non-residents will be required to submit one proof of residency from the list in order to verify mailing address for the school.

Students who do not present valid proofs of residency by September 1st will be withdrawn as of that date.

Parents and guardians should contact their child's school for any questions concerning this process.

Gainesville City School System encourages the community to support our REACH Georgia Scholars program by making a financial contribution to provide an opportunity for select GCSS students to pursue a college education. REACH Georgia is a needs-based scholarship program that pairs middle school students (Scholars) with mentors, coaches and additional resources to prepare them for college and careers. REACH Scholars who successfully complete the program and graduate from high school earn a \$10,000 scholarship paid over four years at a Georgia college or technical college of their choice. 100% of all donations collected will contribute toward REACH scholarships.
