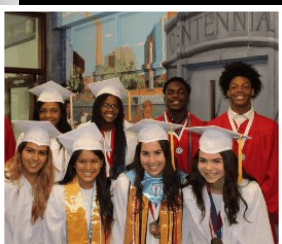

## POINTS OF PRIDE

### Our School District

- ◆ Due to SPLOST funding, a new elementary school, Mundy Mill Learning Academy, opened in August 2017, and a new 30 classroom wing was added to Centennial Arts Academy. Construction is currently underway for a new Enota school with a completion date of July 2018.
- ◆ The district's College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) score increased from 68.1 in 2016 to 72.2 in 2017. All schools received a 4 or 5 star rating on their climate ratings. The number of students reading on grade level increased in grades 3, 5, and 8 and in American Literature.
- ◆ On the 2017 Georgia Milestones, the percentage of students reading on grade level increased by 3 percentage points on End-of-Grade (EOG) assessments. The overall EOG ELA (English Language Arts) and the EOG Math scores increased by 2 percentage points, while the percentage of students passing social studies increased by 4 percentage points.
- ◆ The district's graduation rate has increased from 79.4% in 2016 to 87.8% in 2017. The district continues to focus on initiatives supporting increases in the graduation rate while decreasing equity gaps.
- ◆ The district's Comprehensive System of Learning Supports consists of three programs: Response to Intervention (RTI), Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS), and Attendance, Behavior, and Classroom Success (ABC). These data based programs identify and assist individual students who are struggling with academics, social issues, and personal behaviors, providing skills and learning tools to successfully complete graduation.
- ◆ Our STEAM program for grades K-12 provides rigorous, integrated academic enrichment tailored to foster critical thinking, problem solving, and creativity through the use of state-of-the-art technology, project-based learning, and group collaboration.

### GCSS Elementary Schools

- ◆ Centennial Arts Academy exceeded the state pass rate in 5th grade ELA and Math on the Milestones.
- ◆ Enota Multiple Intelligences Academy had the highest percentage of students scoring in the Distinguished Learning level in ELA and the highest percentage of students reading on grade level for the district on the Milestone assessment.
- ◆ Fair Street International Academy increased its CCRPI score from 55.1 to 64.1 with notable growth in achievement, exceeding the state average growth rate.
- ◆ Gainesville Exploration Academy had the overall highest student attendance for the district for the 2016-2017 school year at 96.53%.
- ◆ New Holland Knowledge Academy increased its pass rate in 3rd grade ELA, and in 3rd and 5th grade Math on the Milestone assessment, and surpassed the district pass rate in 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade Math.
- ◆ As the district's newest school, Mundy Mill Learning Academy had the highest student attendance percentage at 97.12 % for October 2017 within two months of opening.



## POINTS OF PRIDE



### Gainesville Middle School

- ◆ Gainesville Middle School exceeded the state pass rate in 8th grade Math by 11 percentage points on the 2017 Milestones. Additional highlights include an increase in performance in 6th grade ELA and Math as well as 8th grade ELA, Math, and Science.
- ◆ For the 2017-2018 school year, the school's broadcasting department received a \$30,000 grant for training, new equipment, and to provide live streaming.
- ◆ In October 2017, GMS honored its second cohort of REACH Georgia Scholars who signed commitments to maintain good grades, attendance, and behavior throughout their middle and high school years to be eligible for a \$10,000 scholarship upon graduating from high school.
- ◆ High school course credit opportunities are available to middle school students in English Literature, Physical Science, Algebra, Spanish, French, Physical Education, Health, Art, and Introduction to Drama.



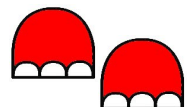
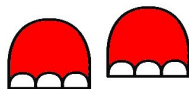

### Gainesville High School

- ◆ Dual Enrollment, Move-on-When-Ready, and Work-Based Learning Internships in local industries enable students to receive college course credit or work experiences that prepare them for entry into the workforce after graduation. The Career, Technical, and Agricultural Education (CTAE) program offers 18 career pathways within the 17 Georgia Career Clusters. During the 2016-2017 school year, 61% of GHS students were enrolled in a CTAE pathway, with 347 CTAE pathways being completed.
- ◆ Eighteen Advanced Placement courses are offered providing rigorous college-level instruction with equity of access to all students. During the 2017-2018 school year, 476 students are enrolled in Advanced Placement courses. Based on the number of students and their scores in AP classes, GHS was recognized by the Georgia Department of Education as a 2017 Advanced Placement Honors School, earning AP STEM, AP STEM Achievement, AP Humanities, and AP Access and Support distinction. The high school also offers an AP Capstone Diploma Program.
- ◆ The Ninth Grade Center allows students to experience a smooth transition from middle school to high school to increase academic success at the high school level. Currently, 87% of our tenth graders who transitioned from the Ninth Grade Center are on track to graduate.
- ◆ Even with an increased number of test takers, ACT scores were the highest in 2017 in comparison to the last five years. The overall composite score increased from 19.9 in 2016 to 20.8 in 2017.
- ◆ The 2017 GHS graduates earned over \$1,400,000 in scholarships in Academics, Arts, Athletics, and NJROTC and received college acceptances from 60 post-secondary institutions around the nation.

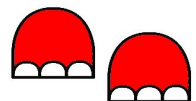
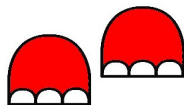
